COLONEL STEVEN L. BASHAM

Colonel Steven L. Basham is commander of the 2nd Bomb Wing, Barksdale Air Force Base, La. He is responsible for providing B-52 aircraft, aircrews and associated support personnel and resources to conduct global bomber operational taskings. Additionally, as the installation commander, he supports 40 tenants including Headquarters Air Force Global Strike Command, Headquarters 8th Air Force, 917th Wing and promotes the welfare of over 9,400 military and civilian personnel, 6,200 family members and 25,000 retirees.

Colonel Basham, was the former vice commander of the 5th Bomb Wing, Minot Air Force Base, North Dakota. In this position he assisted with overseeing operations involving the wing's fleet of B-52H bombers providing rapid-response, combat-ready force in support of United States Strategic Command and theater Combatant Command operations.



A 1989 graduate of Officer Training School, Colonel Basham served as chief of the combat plans division for the 607th Air Operations Center, Osan Air Base, Republic of South Korea. He has held numerous staff and flying assignments, to include commanding the 393rd Bomb Squadron, Whiteman AFB, Mo., the director of operations for the 325th Bomb Squadron at Whiteman AFB, as well as the director of staff for the 509th Bomb Wing at Whiteman AFB.

Colonel Basham is a command pilot with more than 3,300 flying hours culminating as a B-1 instructor pilot, B-2 instructor and evaluator pilot, and B-52 pilot. He flew the first B-2 combat mission as well as multiple 30-hour B-2 sorties from Missouri to Serbia and back during Operation ALLIED FORCE. He also served as director of operations for the first combat deployment of the B-2 during Operation IRAQI FREEDOM.
